## Pre-school

I just wanted to update you on the situation with Pre-school. We had a meeting with the committee and Local Authority this week to look at the overall problem of limited places for children of pre-school age.

We discussed the school site and the possibility of the Pre-School being relocated to the school grounds but within their own separate area.

The Local Authority will now look into this to see if it is a viable option.

We also discussed that while it would be good to have good links between school and pre-school, they would remain two separate establishments that would run separately from each other.

As stated before, these are purely initial discussions so that pre-school can look at their options for possible sites in the future.

## Attendance

This week's whole school attendance was a disappointing 90.73%. This is much lower than what is expected for the school.

There were also 19 children late for school this week.

I can't stress enough how important it is that your child attends school and is on time for the start of the day.
