Reminders

- PE kit must be worn for PE brought into school on a Monday and taken home on a Friday.

 we keep concentration levels high.

Online Safety

I have been alerted to some information by safeguarding about a WhatsApp group that children are being added to (currently 800+ members). This group appears to be asking users to add all their contacts to create the largest group in the world without adults being present. The concern is the content within the group — the majority of users appear to be minors, although there is no way to verify this. Aside from the general bad language and online bullying and harassment, there is evidence of racist, homophobic and explicit language. Please also share this information with older siblings, as this may be more relevant for them.

World Book Day

World Book Day this year is on Thursday March 7th. The Puffins are having a Pirate themed day based on the book 'Ten Little Pirates'. Mrs Dinsdale has put a class post on DoJo about this explaining the details a little further.

The rest of the school should come dressed as their favourite character out of a book and also bring that book to school. We will be having an assembly in the morning, where the children get to show off their costumes and talk about their book.
